Kaboom Percussion are passionate about creating and performing fun and exciting new music for audiences of all ages. Formed by Catherine Betts (M.Mus) and Joshua Webster (M.Mus) in 2014 and now a full-time ensemble, the pair is busy with an interesting mix of performance, composition, commissions, workshops, school residencies, holiday programs, corporate PD, self-publishing, and YouTube-ing.

Largely active in schools, their show has been enthusiastically received by more than 40,000 students and teachers all across Australia.



Sparked by a video of their variation on the popular Cup Song, their YouTube channel has grown immensely over the past two years, with over 36 million views and 126,000 subscribers.

In addition to writing music for their own shows, they are establishing themselves as the go-to people for large group performances with works written for up to 400 players! They have written works for Defying Gravity, the Collegium Youth Orchestra, Perth College, Hale School, and Peter Canley Anglican Community School. Their original percussion music has also been performed by ensembles in Australia, England, Scotland, France, Japan, Germany, USA and Luxembourg.



Eneksis Vocal Ensemble is made up of music students at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts, Edith Cowan University. The choir was established in 2002 by its director Micheál McCarthy, and is widely considered to be one of the best choirs of its kind in Australia.
